It provides the definition for the application programming interfaces, the associated utility interfaces and command line shells for compatibility of different applications and software with different operating systems and variants of UNIX. POSIX is an evolving family of computer standards that consists of a wide spectrum of operating system components ranging from the C programming language and interfaces based on shell to administration of computer systems.
